It was first convened by the General Teaching Council for Scotland [GTCS] in 2007 in collaboration with other teacher regulatory authorities in Europe, North America, Africa, Caribbean, and Australasia.

Besides Scotland, several other countries and regions had hosted including the General Teaching Council for Wales [2009]; South African Council for Educators [2011]; Ontario College of Teachers [2014], Teaching Council of Ireland [2016], Teaching Council of New Zealand [2018], and Australasia Teacher Regulatory Authorities [ATRA] hosted by the Queensland College of Teachers, Australia [2024]. IFTRA comprises delegates of member organisations which are continental, national and subnational teacher regulatory agencies. Thus, IFTRA has only organisations as members and delegates must be accredited by such organisations.

- Questions from the moderator and audience will be directed to the panellists only after all ten-minute PowerPoint presentations have been concluded.
- Submission of papers by panellists - MS Word version + headshot + 100-word bio: March 31, 2026; PowerPoint: May 15, 2026.
